


Uploading Current and Prescribed Meds are two simple, but separate processes. This is the process to upload Current Medication Lists and Prescription History with EMR Connect to the Shared Care Portal.

1. With the patient open in GP system, open EMR Connect with the patient in context.



2. Ensure all new medications are recorded in GP CIS. Go to **Current Medications** in EMRC widget.

3. Choose current medication/s to upload with a tick.

4. Select Update

NOTE: If a patient is no longer on a medication that has been uploaded as 'current' to the SCT, uncheck the tick box then press "Update".

5. Ensure past prescribed list is accurate in GP CIS

6. Go to **Prescriptions** in EMRC and apply filter based on time last prescribed or uploaded.

7. Tick Medication/s to upload.

8. Select Update.
